

It is notified that CBSE will conduct the next <u>UGC-NET for Junior Research Fellowship & Eligibility for Assistant Professor</u> on 08th July, 2018 (Sunday). As per the revised scheme, the test will consist of two papers as below:

Paper	Marks	Number of Question	Duration
I	100	50 questions. All are compulsory	1 Hour (09:30 AM to 10:30 AM) IST
II	200	100 questions. All are compulsory	2 Hours (11:00 AM to 1:00 PM) IST

Paper-I shall consist of 50 objective type compulsory questions each carrying 2 marks. The questions which will be of general nature, intended to assess the teaching/research aptitude of the candidate. It will primarily be designed to test reasoning ability, comprehension, divergent thinking and general awareness of the candidate.

Paper-II shall consist of 100 objective type compulsory questions each carrying 2 marks which will be based on the subject selected by the candidate.

The upper age limit for appearing in JRF has also been raised by two years, i.e. from the existing upper age limit of 28 years to 30 years (the relaxation as earlier will remain same). The candidates who desire to appear in the test may see the detailed notification available on the website http://cbsenet.nic.in from 01st February, 2018. The candidates are required to apply online from 06th March, 2018. The last date for applying online is 05th April, 2018 and fee can be paid up to 06th April, 2018.

UPDATED (MERGED) CBSE NET SYLLABUS OF ENGLISH

SUBJECT CODE - 30

The CBSE has revised the pattern and scheme of the exam from July 2018. The pattern of the exam has been changed form 3 papers (Paper I, II, and III) to 2 papers (Paper I and II). There are no changes in the pattern of paper 1, but paper 2 and paper 3 has been merged into one paper.

According to the notification of CBSE UGC NET Examination in English, called paper II. Paper II will have 100 multiple choice questions (MCQs) with each question carrying two (2) marks i.e., 200 marks in total. All questions are compulsory in the papers. The objective type questions will include multiple choices, matching type, true/false and assertion-reasoning type etc.

For CBSE UGC NET, aspirants, we have merged the entire syllabi of Paper II and Paper III of the subject of English
